

Textbooks for less: Where to buy your course textbooks for cheap

Are textbooks costing you as much as tuition? Here are some ways you can find them for less than what they cost at the bookstore.

egardless of whether you are a freshman or a graduating senior, you will agree that buying textbooks can be expensive. Especially in the bookstore, you might find yourself breaking the bank to purchase all the books and supplies you need for a class. Like me, you may wonder if there are ways to get your books other than through the campus bookstore. Here's a list of suggestions that might help you save money on your books:

ASK FRIENDS AND CLASSMATES WHO HAVE PREVIOUSLY TAKEN THE CLASS

Before doing anything, first ask your friends and other classmates that you know have taken the course if you can borrow, buy or have their old textbooks — odds are, they still have them. If you borrow or buy your textbooks from them, you can save yourself time

RENT FROM THE BOOKSTORE INSTEAD OF BUYING THEM

Consider checking whether your books can be rented at the bookstore. Renting your textbooks can be cheaper than buying them and it's also good if you don't want to end up with books that you'll never use again. However, keep in mind that renting is not available for every textbook at the bookstore.

THE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Even though most public libraries

aren't allowed to have textbooks, they sometimes do have other books that are needed for english, writing, history or literature classes. Public libraries are great places to find books for these types of classes, and the best thing is, you can borrow them for free. If there's a waitlist on a particular book you need, make sure to put a hold on it early and also remember to check different libraries that may have items available as ebooks. Some good public library systems to check out are King County, Seattle, Tacoma and Puyallup. There may be other good public library systems depending on where you live.

THE UW LIBRARY

The UW Tacoma library has limited copies of textbooks available for checkout. The library also has some textbooks available on the library website as ebooks which are able to be viewed or downloaded as PDF files. To access ebooks, go to the UWT library homepage and search for the title of a book. Unfortunately, not every book is available at the library. This is where buying your textbooks from others locally and online become options.

OFFERUP

OfferUp is a website and mobile app that lets you sell and buy things locally. OfferUp is a good option for trying to get your textbooks because it only shows you offers from people in a certain area, and it doesn't come with the hassle of trying to buy something online. You can get products faster locally than if you were waiting for something to be shipped to you.

EBAY

eBay is great site for bidding and buying, but did you also know that you can buy your textbooks there? Getting them from eBay might take a while depending on where the books are being sent from, but it can be cheaper than buying from the bookstore.

AMAZON

Amazon is a common choice for getting textbooks. On Amazon, you have the options of buying, renting and even selling back your textbooks. Amazon's prices for buying and renting textbooks are usually cheaper than at the bookstore and books can be rented for longer than one quarter.

CHEGG

Chegg.com is an online site that specializes in textbook rentals. On Chegg, you have the option to rent and purchase books and ebooks. Books and ebooks on Chegg are generally cheaper than some other sites and orders that are over \$35 get free shipping. Like Amazon, you can also sell back your old textbooks (beware, you don't get a lot back for selling).

BARNES & NOBLE

Barnes & Noble is another option, though I wouldn't highly recommend buying your textbooks here or on the B&N online store because they usually sell at full-price. However, Barnes & Noble does have an online marketplace that sells items for less and the

store does offer deals and coupons when several items are purchased at one time (such as \$10 off \$100). You can rent books from their online store. and Barnes & Noble also buys back textbooks.

CHECK ONLINE FOR PDF FILES

As a last resort, you can always surf the web and see if your textbooks are available online as PDF files. While this doesn't always come up with results, you might get lucky.

TIPS & WARNINGS:

Be careful of scammers and other shady sites that just want your money. Especially if you want to sell back your books, make sure the site is credible and has good reviews. If you're using a site like eBay or going on OfferUp, check the seller's rating and feedback. If you can, set up accounts at multiple library systems so that you have more places to get your books if one library does not have it or if there are too many holds. If buying an older edition of a textbook, check in with your professor first to make sure it will still work for the course.

not forget the extra 15 percent off when you use your Husky ID. It beats paying \$5 at Starbucks which will add up in the long-run.

(3) THERE IS FREE PRINTING IN THE COMPUTER LABS AND CENTER FOR STU-DENT INVOLVEMENT — PRINTER AND PAPER ARE BOTH PROVIDED.

No need to bring your own paper to print at one of the printing stations around campus or pay to use the printer at the library. Just head over to one of the computer labs located in Cherry Parkes room 005 or Walsh Garner room 108 if you need to print in black and white. Color printing is available at the Center for Student Involvement inside of the University Y across from

MYOU CAN CHECK OUT MACBOOKS, DIGITAL SLR CAMERAS, VIDEO CAM-**ERAS AND MUCH MORE FROM THE IT** HELPDESK.

Students can checkout media equipment from the IT Helpdesk in WG 108. Equipment is available on a first-come, first-served basis for checkout periods of up to one week. The following equipment is available to checkout: Macbooks, Windows laptops, boomboxes, data projectors,

digital SLR cameras, digital still cameras, headphones, laser pointers, lighting kits, microphones, speakers, transcribers, tripods and video cameras.

(5) FREE FOOD AND HYGIENE PRODUCTS ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE PANTRY IN DOU 104.

The Pantry provides free supplemental, nutritional and culturally relevant food as well as hygiene items to all UWT students. You can stop by Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., or complete a food request form online. There is a limit of 10 food items and three hygiene products per person, per week. There are diapers and baby wipes if you have little ones, as well as donated winter essentials like jackets, gloves, hats, scarves and socks.

(CAMPUS SECURITY WILL GIVE YOU A RIDE TO YOUR CAR OR CLASS IF YOU FEEL UNSAFE TO WALK AT NIGHT.

Do you have any night classes that run after 6 p.m.? Feeling a little uncomfortable or scared that your car is parked up the hill in an alley away from campus? No worries. Just call campus security at 253-692-4416, explain your situation and they'll be more than happy to drive you to your car or Court 17 — student safety is always a priority. Campus security is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and 365 davs a vear.

YOU CAN GET AMAZON PRIME FOR FREE WITH YOUR UW EMAIL.

Textbooks can be pretty expensive from the campus bookstore, but fear not. As a student, you are eligible for a free six-month trial of Amazon Prime which can be used to rent and purchase textbooks at lower prices than the bookstore. After the sixmonth period, it's only \$50 to continue your yearly membership. Amazon Prime includes free two-day shipping, Prime Video, Prime Music, Prime Reading, Prime Wardrobe and more exclusive offers. Just simply sign up through Prime Student with your uw.edu email.

13 THERE IS FREE 3D PRINTING FOR ALL UWT STUDENTS.

From 3D animal sculptures to phone cases, to chess pieces and smartphone stands, UWT students are allowed to use the campus' 3D printer. Just no weapons or sexually explicit items. Stop by WG 108 to learn more.

O FREE PARKING ON THE SIDE OF AND **BEHIND THE UNIVERSITY Y.**

Paying for parking can truly be a

pain because it eventually all adds up. But there are several free parking spaces around campus, you just need to be quick enough to snatch a spot. In front of the University Y, there is a free two hour limit parking area that can hold around eight cars, as well as free parking on the side of and behind the building without a time restriction. It can fill up pretty quickly, but it's worth checking when you're trying to find a place to park.
